Employer Details:

Calgary Wildlife Rehabilitation Society (Calgary Wildlife) is a registered non-profit established in 1993 to provide professional care for wildlife rehabilitation. Our goal is to Rescue, Rehabilitate and Release –the three R’s of responsible wildlife management. CWRS is an accredited veterinary wildlife hospital located within The City of Calgary. Each year we receive over 2,400 injured or orphaned wild animals and respond to thousands of wildlife-related calls from the public.

Job Description:

Calgary Wildlife has an exciting opportunity for motivated Wildlife Technicians. Under the supervision of senior wildlife staff, the Wildlife Technician is responsible for providing rehabilitation treatment to injured and orphaned wildlife and assisting in daily operations of the facility. This position requires weekday, weekend and evening work and is physically demanding. Successful candidates can expect to be challenged and gain knowledge in the handling and physical restraint of wildlife species, laboratory procedures and diagnostics, emergency nursing, patient assessments and treatments, husbandry and record-keeping. This is a unique experience in our hands on, fast-paced work environment.

Responsibilities include:

Food preparation, Cleaning cages and enclosures, Husbandry

Medical exams, treatment, and lab work under the supervision of the Wildlife Technicians, Lead Veterinarian and Veterinary Technician

Communicate with the public/veterinary clinics regarding wildlife concerns and transfers of animals to Calgary Wildlife

Coordinate and supervise volunteers for wildlife care and rescues

Maintain records

Qualifications/Requirements:

Applicant must be 18 years of age or older

Preference given to AHT and/or B.Sc. (Biology, Ecology, Zoology, Animal Health)

Preference given to those with veterinary clinic/medical experience and husbandry experience

Rabies vaccinated or willing to obtain vaccination (proof of vaccination and titre value required)

Have a passion for wildlife rehabilitation, husbandry, veterinary medicine, wildlife conservation, ecology, or related field.

Strong work ethic, dependable, honest

Work well as a team and under minimal supervision

Strong communication skills (both written and verbal English) and professional telephone etiquette

Ability to work under pressure and multi-task

Position requires physically fit candidates (must be able to lift 50lbs.)

Must be available to work days, evenings and weekends, During the summer months Calgary Wildlife is open 7am – 9pm, 7 days a week.

Work safely, and train others accordingly
